

YOUR LESSONS WITH EUROPEAN HOMESTAY

AT THE BEGINNING OF YOUR HOMESTAY COURSE YOUR TEACHER WILL COMPLETE THE EUROPEAN FRAMEWORK CHART TO ASSESS YOUR LEVEL AND AT THE END OF THE COURSE SO THAT YOU CAN SEE IF YOU HAVE MADE ANY PROGRESS.

Lessons begin at 09.00 and will end at 12.15 if you have booked a 15 hour course or at 13.15 if you have booked a 20 hour course. These times can vary according to arrangements you make with your teacher to suit your needs. If you have booked a 25 or 30 hour course you will probably prefer to have lunch at 13.15 and then continue for a further one or two hours according to the intensity of your programme.

After lessons you are free to relax in your teacher's home, do your homework or go out alone if you are an adult or with your teacher and family on a social outing which will give you more opportunity to improve your fluency through conversation with your teacher, family and friends in a friendly environment.

*On these **social outings** you will also be able to practice the language learned during your lessons in the morning with your teacher there to help you if you need it.*

YOUR LESSONS

Lessons will start on Monday usually at 09.00 when your teacher will discuss your language learning needs with you. Your teacher will also assess your level of English and plan a course of study with you.

Midweek and at the end of the first week your teacher will ask you if you are satisfied with the course plan and if you wish to make any changes to the course structure. With this feedback your teacher will make the necessary changes to the course to suit your needs.

Of course you don't have to choose such an intensive course as you might prefer a more relaxed pace of 15, 20 or 25 hours of lessons.

WHAT HAPPENS ONCE I ARRIVE AT MY TEACHER'S HOME?

Students usually arrive on the Sunday and after being welcomed into your teacher's home you will be given time to settle in.

Then your teacher will explain to you details of daily activities such as mealtimes, family routines, lessons and the local area. At this point you can also plan your social activities with your teacher telling him/her what your interests are.

ACCOMMODATION
